Mark Hobler made a motion to adjourn the meeting at 7:22 pm and this was seconded by Kathie Bruhn.





#### June 2016 Tech Tip – An interesting observation...

The 2014 Premiere Edition Corvette was one of my favorites. OK, so what, no big deal. You can't get one any longer. Well, that is a true statement, but one can still dream. I believe what drew me to the Premiere Edition was the fact that there were absolutely no options- everything they could put on those Corvettes was standard equipment including everything available in the Genuine Corvette Accessory catalog. Even though they had a fairly steep window sticker of \$75,000 for the Coupe and \$80,000 for the convertible, you were getting at least \$3,500 in accessories and options at no charge! These were maximum option 3LT/ Z-51 Corvettes with a little price break thrown in. Of course, this was a Corvette for the person that literally wanted everything possible put on their cars. Another little benefit to ordering a 3LT Corvette, you can select the exclusive Brownstone Leather interior. There is also a unique 3LT option if you like black interiors. For \$395 you can get red or yellow French Seam stitching on your 3LT level black interior. All this is very nice, but what is the "interesting observation"? (Continued next page)



The 3LT is the highest level of the 3 option groups, and the Z-51 is a suspension, engine, and handling package that adds larger diameter wheels, dry sump engine, electronic limited slip, lots of different coolers, and higher gearing. On paper, a Z-51 is \$5,000 more, and that scares a few folks away from ordering a Z-51.

I decided to go to the online Chevrolet website and build out a 2016 Corvette equipped like the Premiere Edition convertible in Long Beach Red instead of Lime Rock Green. You can duplicate this process with your favorite color interior and exterior and see a similar result. I specified a 3LT/ Z-51 Convertible, Long Beach Red, Brownstone interior, body color vents, Destination charge (built in base price online), Chrome Torque Wheels (accessory), standard painted wheels, Magnetic Select ride, N-10 Exhaust, 8 speed auto trans, Navigation, carbon fiber dash, under hood liner, Corvette Luggage, Indoor cover, outdoor cover, embroidered floor mats, front & rear black molded splash guards, & custom doorsill plates. This all came up to \$89,080 - definitely a big price tag. So I decided to option out a non-Z51 model thinking I would save at least \$5,000. (Continued next page)

There were a few interesting surprises when one does a side by side comparison. As I wrote earlier the 3LT/ Z-51 convertible is exactly \$5,000 more than the 3LT convertible (\$75,145 vs. \$70,145.) One would think that would hold consistent through the entire pricing of both these models. However, that is not the case. There are 3 major options with a sizeable price difference. Here is a comparison...

3LT/ Z-51 convertible base price \$75,140. 3LT convertible base price \$70,140.

Chrome Torque Wheels \$4440. Chrome Torque Wheels \$6,080.

Magnetic Select Ride Magnetic Select Ride \$1795. \$3,495.

N-10 Exhaust- standard equipment -\$0-N-10 Exhaust \$1,195.

Total \$84,095 \$83,630.

The price difference of those 3 major options brings the price of both models within \$465 of each other. Now the Z-51 is costing you \$465. For that \$465 you get a few very notable and expensive equipment upgrades-


\*Electronic limited slip differential (ELSD) \*Larger H.D. Radiator

\*Performance gearing 2.73 vs. 2.41 \* transmission & differential coolers

\*brake caliper, trans, & rear end cooling ducts \* LT1 engine with dry sump oil system

So the tech tip here is, if you are going to order a loaded Corvette, always get the Z-51 whether it is a 1LT, 2LT, or 3LT. The \$465 price difference is a small price to pay for the upgrade in equipment. Another important reason is the difference at trade-in time. The Z-51 optioned Corvette will bring a lot more than the \$465 initially paid. (Continued next page)








Getting back to the rest of the 2016 Corvette, all the other options are priced the same on the Z-51 vs. non-Z51- Auto trans, carbon fiber dash, tint coat color, luggage, mats, and covers...all the same money. I wanted to make you aware of this little hidden fact in Corvette pricing in case you were considering purchasing a new C-7, because many of us would logically assume that the \$5,000 price would carry through to the bottom line of the window sticker- that is not the case.

Save the wave, and a few bucks
