
Jeff informed the club that Jay Brown had sent in a thank you card for the donation made to The American Cancer Society in remembrance of his son's passing.





In recent years, over 99% of all Corvettes built since 2000 are still in operation. The Corvette is an extremely reliable and structurally tough automobile. There are documented records of late model LS series motors, (usually in Silverado pick-ups), lasting well over 400,000 miles without ever being rebuilt. If you have an opportunity to get a 1997 or newer Corvette equipped with an LS motor, don't let the 50K or 75K odometer readings drive you away. It is felt within the auto tech community that the LS series and the newest LT series engines are the finest, most durable power plants GM has ever produced. To put it in proper prospective, if you drive 4,000 to 5,000 miles a year and used high quality synthetic oil, the engine would last 80 to 100 years before you or that 5th owner down the road might even think about an engine rebuild! Team that up with a no rust body, as well as owners that never use their Corvettes in a winter road salt environment, and you have a car that could outlive your great great grandchildren! 

The latest trend is to remove those old tech original carbureted gas guzzling engines and replace them with one of these clean fuel injected LS series motors. The use of LS series motors in these older Corvettes provides unreal acceleration and mileage while emitting 15 to 20 times cleaner exhaust compared to the stock motor with a regular non-cat exhaust system. If you ever decide to do this, the tech tip is to save everything, and never discard the original motor and transmission should you decide to sell your Corvette- the next owner may be one of those originality guys. GM has been encouraging the conversion to LS motors in everything from older Corvettes, Malibus, and Novas as well as those older '50's, '60's, and 70's land yacht Cadillacs, Bonnevilles, Electras, 98's, and pick-ups. Instead of getting 10 to 12 miles per gallon from an older 327 or 350 small block Corvette, you can expect 24 to 28 mpg with 350 to 450 horsepower and much cleaner emissions. With fuel costing \$3.00 to \$4.00 a gallon, the conversion to LS power makes your classic Corvette relevant once again. (Sort of difficult to enjoy yourself paying \$.40 a mile to drive these older cars). To give you an idea how serious GM is about this, the General Motors Performance Parts Division offers a complete LS-3 Corvette engine with a 4L70E- 4 speed automatic trans with computer, wiring harnesses, and sensors made just for dropping in any of the old classic GM cars. These conversions are so easy that they call it "plug and play". Smooth mild idle, 430 horsepower and a tough overdrive automatic (There are also manual transmission conversions). Another reason GM likes their cars restored and using LS engines, it sends a subtle message that GM builds quality cars that are very reliable and durable. (Continued next page)







Buying the car of your dreams may be a bucket list thing, but it can also be very rewarding. Perhaps, you never thought of this, but as a member of the Ozaukee Corvette Club you are in a perfect position to restore that Corvette dream car regardless of its' current condition. You have a built-in restoration team with knowledge and resources to accomplish your goal. I will use the example of Jim Baker's 1965 Coupe. Here is a car in near perfect condition. It does not show any signs of wear after 51 years! Jim's car is also a time capsule of technology. His car was cutting edge and state of the art in 1965, yet it is still able to turn heads today. Consider this, is there any reason to believe other than human error, that Jim's Corvette will not see its' 100th birthday in 49 years? Not only that, there have been children that have seen Jim's Corvette at Wayne's or in our parades that probably made a promise to themselves that someday they will own a '65 Corvette. This is one reason we say all Corvettes are historically significant.

There may be some of you that are looking for a particular C-5 or C-6 Corvette. That is a wonderful thing to pursue, and one should aggressively go after the Corvette of their dreams- not because I said so, but because it gives one a sense of accomplishment, and that special "words cannot describe" feeling each time you start your Corvette. (And you thought you were the only one that felt that!)

The price you paid for your Corvette may be somewhat forgotten or a little foggy. That is because the enjoyment far outweighs the money paid. There are high mileage cars, neglected cars, or those rare barn finds. None of that ever matters, because we can remove all the wearing parts and restore the Corvette to original condition. The "3-B's"- bearings, bushings, and ball joints are a cost effective great first step. Some owners complained about all the parts they have replaced and engines and transmissions rebuilt because they paid too little for their car. Paying more for a car in better condition is the trade-off. It seems besides physical condition, a Corvette's mileage dictates value. There is nothing different or tricky about buying a good used Corvette compared to any other American or GM car- it is still a Chevy under that sleek body, and everything is easy to repair, replace, or correct. I think they call it "That Great GM Feeling".


